



Electrical Engineer **Jasmine Tutt** is this year's Homer L. Ferguson Award recipient and the first African American woman to receive the award. Tutt joined Newport News Shipbuilding's Apprentice School as a shipboard electrician apprentice in 2014 with a bachelor's degree in chemistry from the College of William & Mary.

During her time at The Apprentice School, Tutt earned an associate's degree in engineering from Tidewater Community College and a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from Old Dominion University.

A native of Lexington, Virginia, Tutt has contributed to new

carrier construction, refueling and complex overhaul (RCOH), and the *Virginia*-Class Submarine Program in addition to several engineering projects. She currently serves as an assistant shift refueling engineer for the shipyard's reactor servicing department.
